

Interprofessional co-operation in breast cancer therapeutic phase, EbreastII

Breast cancer treatment is complex and it is widely known that the patients' care and service pathway associated with breast cancer is still discontinuous. An interprofessional team including medical, nursing and allied health professionals provides appropriate patient cancer pathway care coordination. There is a need for Interprofessionnal education both at the basic education of these health care professionals, in house training of cancer clinics and learning materials for independent continuous professional development CPD. Ebreast II project aims: 1) To produce new research knowledge to develop health care teachers' and staff understanding about breast cancer care and therapies by reviewing and create evidence based knowledge about interprofessional breast cancer care and treatments using the methodology of integrative literature review, observational study and qualitative questionnaire study. 2) To improve the quality of breast cancer care and therapies and health care staff education related to this, developing three e-learning modules (13 ECTS) using evidence-based approach linked with the pedagogical principle of the Interprofessional orientation. 3) To enhance competences related to interprofessional co-operation in breast cancer therapeutic phase among the teachers, students and health professionals developing the created e-learning modules by means of testing and implementing the e-learning package at the European level. This approach focus on the feedback obtained from and within the partnership, participants, experts and the steering committee members. It is

made available linked to EU EPALE dissemination platform that gives open access resources for education namely for educational and health care institutions who otherwise could not afford or for some other reason are not able to have this kind of learning resources. In addition, an intensive week program introducing the potential users of the online course to its topics and use will be perform with the participation of 4 to 5 HESAV lecturers funding from Swiss national agency Movetia. The most important impact on the project participating organizations as well as on other organizations, students, practitioners and teaching staff that take the e-learning package in their educational use will be harmonizing quality and contents of education in the field of interprofessional breast cancer treatment and its safety.
